Kindergarten-year 6













Year 3 rocked their History projects this week! Witnessing their hard work pay off was truly inspiring, and the final designs were nothing short of fantastic.



Recently, our Community, Educators and Learners completed a survey for the school to provide feedback on areas that were working well and areas that needed Development. In the interest of transparency and open communication, we have shared the results below.

Overall, Students Satisfaction is down on 2022 numbers by an average of 1%, while Parent Satisfaction is up 1% on 2022 numbers.

We have also highlighted below the areas of development and areas of strength that were raised in the comments section.

Development Areas

Infrastructure and Facilities

There was a heavy emphasis on the issue of parking, while there was commentary around the Senior school facilities. Issues such as lack of grass areas, shaded areas and bathroom facilities also featured heavily. Canteen food quality, variety and price was also raised.

These issues are being addressed with Junior school receiving new shades in the Quad, while the STEAM building will address a number of the facility concerns. The STEAM building will be handed over this year and this will alleviate most of the issues as most demountable rooms will be removed and replaced with play areas. New furniture has already been delivered for use in the STEAM building. The Canteen area will be expanded to cater for more equipment, which will allow for

greater quality of food and greater healthier options. Prices are being regularly reviewed to make sure that they are affordable.

Bullying – It has been raised that there are incidents of bullying in the school and that has affected some learners. The majority of issues seem to be around verbal abuse rather than physical abuse.

The new principals for both senior school and junior school have revamped the schools behaviour management policy to address these concerns raised and will take a tough stance on any form of bullying. This is further being supported by the roll out of Prophetic character leadership programs which the Islamic department and the VRT team will be delivering in 2024.

Communication – Parents have advised that communication with teachers has been difficult and that there are numerous platforms to use. The school going forward will only be using Sentral for parent and student communication. Other programs such as Canvas will be used for teacher student correspondence for homework assessments and internal notifications.

Academic quality – Parents have raised issues with some of the

curriculum being taught in various subjects. Curriculum is NESA mandated and teachers have to teach the curriculum as provided by the Government. The school nonetheless has reviewed most of its class programmes in order to make them more engaging and more proactive.

Areas of Strength

Islamic culture – The Islamic culture of the school and its Islamic identity was highlighted as a key area for coming to the school. Friendly environment for families and educators.

Extracurricular initiatives -

It was highlighted that the school have many initiatives in the school making it more exciting for students. This includes things such as Friday Initiatives robotics after school activities and sporting events. Vision and Values – People are happy with the new Vision and Values and are pleased with the direction that the school is headed in.

Holistic Learners – Parents, Learners and educators are happy with the new Wholistic learner approach which give Learners a chance to experience real world exposure and beyond, creating pioneers of the future.




